



Supervision

The Honor Choir Camp staff includes Director, Dr. Alan McClung; Assistant Director, Jennifer Alaracon; four classroom choral music educators; and eight choral music education student/counselors. Campers will be consistently and responsibly supervised. A primary supervisory objective will be to provide campers with clear expectations and appropriate structure at all times. Dormitory

Bruce Hall Dormitory is located immediately across the street from the UNT Music Building. Girls are assigned to one floor; boys are assigned to rooms on a different floor. Rooms are basic with two beds to a room. Community bathrooms are located on the hall. Campers are expected to bring a sleeping bag or sheets, a pillow, towel, and personal toiletries. On the registration sheet, students may request a specific roommate, otherwise, it is an opportunity to make a new friend.

In ensure safety, strict dormitory supervision can and should be expected. In the dormitory, we will have one adult for every ten campers. Dr. McClung or Jennifer Alaracon will sleep in the dormitory and provide emergency assistance all hours of the day or night.

Meals

Across the street from the Music Building is **BRUCE HALL**. All meals will be served in the Bruce Hall cafeteria and supervised by assigned staff members. Due to the summer schedule, selection may be somewhat limited, but food service has assured us that all meals will be sufficiently varied and plentiful.
