The Austin-based **Trío En**, formerly known as Trio Rouge, was formed in the summer of 2019 at the Butler School of Music. “En”, rooted in the Chinese character 緣, has multiple meanings depending on the context. Trío En refers to connection, to destiny, and to opportunity.

Trío En was recognized as the winner of the 2020 MTNA Chamber Music Competition and the silver medalist of the Senior String Division at the 2020 Fischhoff Chamber Competition in the United States. In addition, they were nominated as one of the semifinalists in the 2020 Concert Artists Guild Victor Elmaleh Competition as well as one of the finalists in the 2021 Coltman Chamber Music Competition.

Trío En was featured on many radio stations and in local newspapers including “Listen and Local” and “From the Butler School” on KMFA 89.5, Austin’s classical music radio station. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Trío En was featured on the 1918 concert series of Salon Concert Austin to rediscover the pieces written during the Flu Pandemic in 1918.

As all alumni of the University of Texas at Austin, prior to Austin, each member studied at distinguished music conservatories and universities including the Cleveland Institute of Music, Manhattan School of Music, New England Conservatory, Rutgers University, and Rice University.

The original members consist of pianist Sohee Kwon, violinist Nick Hammel, and cellist Chan Song An under the guidance of the visionary faculty at UT Austin including Anton Nell, Andrew Brownell, Daniel Ching and Sandy Yamamoto and Joshua Gindele from the Miró Quartet. Also, they have participated in many masterclasses from Bion Tsang, Gregory Allen, and Gregory Beaver. This summer, new string members joined the trio, violinist Jihee Lim and cellist Yeyoung Yoo.
