BIOGRAPHIES

Kimberly McConnell is in her second year of teaching at Colleyville Heritage High School where she serves as head director. Prior to coming to CHHS, Kimberly taught in Oregon. She received both her master's and bachelor's of music education from the University of Oregon. In Oregon Mrs. McConnell was director of choral activities at Lane Community College for 13 years before returning to high school teaching. While in Oregon, choirs under Mrs. McConnell achieved the highest awards statewide and nationally, including the coveted first place in state in 2013 and 2018. She has been a presenter and had choirs perform at OMEA (Oregon Music Educators Association) and regional ACDA (American Choral Directors Association) conferences. Mrs. McConnell was awarded Music Educator of the Year by the Salem Symphony for 2018–2019, and received the Oregon ACDA Podium Award in 2020–2021. Kimberly relocated to the DFW area last year. She loves teaching the wonderful students at Colleyville Heritage High School, where the choirs have continued to maintain the high standards of the school's strong choral tradition. Kimberly enjoys composing and arranging. She lives with her husband Monte in the DWF area.

Jenna Hernandez McLean is in her fourth year of teaching high school choir and second year at Colleyville Heritage High School. She has also been previously involved as a conductor with community youth choirs such as the Willamette Girl Choir and the Youth Chorus of Central Texas. In addition to her work as an educator and conductor, Jenna is also an active professional ensemble singer. Recent and upcoming engagements include appearances with the Santa Fe Desert Chorale, Voces8 US Scholars, Orpheus Chamber Singers, Dallas Chamber Choir, Incarnatus, Servire, Verdigris Ensemble, and the Highland Park Chorale. She also serves as a teaching artist and coordinator with the Voces8 Foundation. Jenna holds a bachelor's degree in choral music education and a master's degree in conducting with a choral emphasis from Baylor University. The child of two music educators, **Leigh Ann McClure** has been the head choral director of the Central High School Choral Music Department in Keller ISD for sixteen years. The CHS Choral Department consists of approximately 300 students, 3 directors, eight concert choirs, and two show choirs. Ms. McClure previously taught in the Arlington, Cleburne, and Alvarado ISDs. Ms. McClure received her BME degree from Baylor University and her MME from The University of North Texas. Her choirs have been consistent UIL Sweepstakes trophy recipients. In 2021, the Chamber Women were named the winners of the inaugural America's Got Choirs' competition sponsored by FeelltLive. These women also performed with the renowned Bella Voce Women of Baylor University in concert in April 2022 and were named the Outstanding Treble Chorus at the prestigious Festival di Voce competition. In addition to having numerous TMEA All-State Choir members, she teaches several all-state choir camps each year and is an active adjudicator, clinician, and honor choir conductor. Ms. McClure has served the Texas Choral Directors Association as secretary; the Texas Music Educators Association as region secretary, MS/JHS region vocal coordinator, region and area vocal chair, 2012 and 2013 All-State

In 2013, she was a recipient of the UIL Sponsor of Excellence award. Prior to coming to Central High School, Ms. LeVie was the assistant choir director at Duncanville High School. During her time at Duncanville she served as a collaborative pianist for the A Cappella Choir's performance at the 2020 Texas Music Educators Association production "It Starts with Music" as well as the collaborative pianist for the A Cappella Men's Choir's 2021 American Choral Directors Association National Conference performance. Ms. LeVie is in her second year as an associate choir director at Central High School and returned to Central after completing her student teaching there in the spring of 2019. At Central, Ms. LeVie directs the Sub-Non-Varsity Treble Choir, the Non-Varsity Tenor-Bass Choir, and the Non-Varsity Show Choir, Voltage.

Sarah Jones serves as director of worship & events at University Baptist Church in Fort Worth. She began her accompanying career in 7th grade—playing for her school choir, leading worship at church, composing original pieces, and arranging hymns. Now, she enjoys collaborating with choirs in Keller, Mansfield, Burleson and Fort Worth ISDs, and considers it an honor to work with such highly respected choral programs throughout DFW. Choirs under Clorese's direction have consistently received sweepstakes awards at UIL Concert and Sight Reading Contest, and her former AP Music Theory students have been highly successful earning college credit and scholarships due to her tutelage. Additionally, Mrs. Porter has served as musical director for the annual musicals including productions of *Grease*, *Singing in the Rain*, *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying* and *Into the Woods*. Clorese Porter is a proud graduate of Paul Lawrence Dunbar High School in Fort Worth and attended Texas Christian University, earning a bachelor of music in education degree. While at TCU she was a member of the Women's Chorus, Choral Union, and Concert Chorale and participated in performances for the TMEA and SWACDA conventions and at Carnegie Hall. Clorese also has a master's degree in music education from the University of North Texas. Clorese is a member of TMEA, TCDA, TMAA and the 2010 recipient of TCDA's Distinguished Young Director Award. Kelly D'Souza Meyers is in her seventh year as a choral music educator, and her first year as the associate director of choirs at Plano Senior High School. Prior to her appointment at Plano Senior, Mrs. Meyers served as the associate director of choirs at Lovejoy High School. While at Lovejoy, she co-directed all levels of choir, led the 7th and 8th grade program, and assisted with the annual high school musical. Choirs under her direction have earned consistent sweepstakes awards at UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Competition, and many of her students earned placement through audition in the Texas All-State Choir. She has presented professional development sessions to teachers on cooperative learning, mental health, and SEL, and she is an active member of TMEA and TCDA. Mrs. Meyers holds both a bachelor of music and master of music in music education from the University of North Texas. She was born in Mumbai, India, and moved to Plano in 2006. Upon moving to Texas, Mrs. Meyers joined choir and fell in love with the beauty and joy of music making. BIOGRAPHIES

Allen Hightower is a seventh generation Texan, and resides in McKinney, with his wife Dr. Kristin Hightower and their two daughters Caroline and Julianne. As the director of Choral Studies at UNT, Allen leads the master's and doctoral programs in choral conducting, and oversees eight ensembles. Allen serves as the conductor of the A Cappella Choir and Grand Chorus, which collaborates annually with the Symphony Orchestra in performances of major choral-orchestral works. As a member of UNT's Early Music faculty, he leads the vocal ensemble Vox Aquilae, an artistic partner of the Baroque Orchestra. Since arriving at UNT in 2016, the A Cappella Choir has received invitations to perform for the Texas Music Educators Association in 2020, National Conference of the American Choral Directors Association in 2021, and Southwestern Division of ACDA in 2022. Vox Aquilae and the Baroque Orchestra were featured in the 2022 virtual conference of the National Collegiate Choral Organization.

As a teacher and conductor, he has visited 30 states, Asia, and Europe. His students hold positions of leadership as choral conductors in public schools, colleges and universities, and churches and community choirs throughout the United States.

Prior to his appointment at UNT, Hightower held the Weston Noble Endowed Chair in Music at Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, where he served as conductor of the renowned Nordic Choir and artistic director of Christmas at Luther. As Luther's director of Choral Activities, he gave leadership to a choral program that included four conductors, six choirs, and over 530 singers. Under his direction, the Nordic Choir performed at the 2014 North Central Division of ACDA, recorded six compact discs, made annual concert tours throughout the United States, and toured Europe on two occasions.

From 2000–2010, he served as professor of music and director of Choral Studies at Sam Houston State University. During his tenure, the SHSU Chorale toured Europe, performed for the 2007 National Convention of the American Choral Directors Association, the 2010 Southwestern Division of ACDA, and the 2003, 2006, and 2010 conventions of the Texas Music Educators Association. His public school teaching career included tenures at Klein High School in Spring, Texas and at Odessa Permian High School in Odessa, where he led the PHS Kantorei and Satin Strings in performance at the 1996 TMEA convention.

Outside of his work in the academic setting, Allen has served as the artistic director of the Houston Masterworks Chorus and Orchestra, leading an annual concert series of choral-orchestral masterworks. As a church musician, he has served Baptist, Congregational, Methodist, and Presbyterian churches in Texas, California, and Minnesota. He currently serves on the Music and Worship staff of Stonebriar Community Church in Frisco, Texas, and is the church music vice-president of the Texas Choral Directors Association. Dr. Hightower has served as an adjunct professor of conducting at the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas.

BIOGRAPHIES

As a conducting student of the Texas choral legend Bev Henson, Allen earned his undergraduate degree in music education and piano from Sam Houston State University. He earned a master's degree in choral conducting from the Eastman School of Music where he was a student of Baroque scholar Alfred Mann, and a master's degree in orchestral conducting from Baylor University, where he served as assistant conductor to Stephen Heyde and accompanist to Donald Bailey and the Baylor Chamber Singers. Allen earned his doctorate in conducting from the University of California, Los Angeles, where he served as assistant conductor to Donald Neuen. Hightower pursued additional orchestral conducting studies with Jung-Ho Pak at USC, choral conducting studies with Joseph Flummerfelt at Westminster Choir College, and choral-orchestral conducting with Helmuth Rilling at the Oregon Bach Festival. After winning first prize in the graduate division of the American Choral Directors Association's Conducting Competition in 1997, Allen served as assistant to Paul Salamunovich, conductor of the Los Angeles Master Chorale. Hightower conducts the Houston Symphony Chorus for 2022–2023.

Kenneth Sieloff is currently a first-year graduate student at the University of North Texas where he is pursuing a master's degree in choral conducting. Prior to UNT, Sieloff served as director of choirs at Permian High School in Odessa, Texas. In his time at Permian HS, Mr. Sieloff's choirs performed at the 2018 Texas Music Educators Association Conference and the 2020 Southwestern ACDA Conference. In 2020, Permian HS Cantus (tenor-bass choir) was selected as National Winner in the Foundation for Music Education Mark of Excellence competition, and in 2021 they were winners of the American Prize in Choral Performance – High School Division. Ensembles under Mr. Sieloff's leadership have consistently earned "Best in Class" and superior ratings in concert and sightreading evaluations. In 2017 he was named a Young Director of Distinction by the Texas Choral Directors Association. Along with his passion for working with young musicians in the classroom, Sieloff has long been dedicated to the art of conducting. In 2011 he competed in the American Choral Directors Association's National Student Conducting Competition in Chicago, IL and won first place. Sieloff enjoys serving as an active clinician and adjudicator throughout Texas, and in 2023 he looks forward to conducting the Arkansas All-State Tenor-Bass Choir. From 2015–2020 Sieloff served as artistic director and conductor of the Allegro Chorale in Midland-Odessa, TX where he implemented a thriving scholarship program for college students who sang with the ensemble. Notable performances with Allegro include *Fern Hill* by Corigliano, *Chichester Psalms* by Bernstein, *Annelies* by Whitbourn, and Aaron Copland's *Appalachian Spring* for chamber orchestra. Sieloff has appeared as guest conductor with The University of Texas of the Permian Basin Symphony Orchestra, the Midland-Odessa Symphony Orchestra & Chorale, and in 2013 conducted a production of Stephen Sondheim's American opera *Sweeney Todd* at Odessa College which featured Metropolitan Opera baritone Gary Simpson. Sieloff holds a bachelor of music education degree from The University of Michigan, where he studied voice with Professor Martha Sheil and conducting with Eugene Rogers, Paul Rardin, and Jerry Blackstone. Ken loves to spend time with his wife Annie, daughter Charlotte, and dogs Lily and Sadie. He enjoys the great outdoors, including hunting, and spending time with friends whenever he has the chance.

BIOGRAPHIES

Born in South Korea, **Dong Hyun Kang** is a pianist, conductor, and educator. He began his musical education with the piano at the age of seven. When he was fifteen, he first appeared in a public concert with Seoul Symphony Orchestra in Seoul Arts Center. In his piano studies since, he has performed in various venues and won prizes in national and international competitions in South Korea and the United States. Kang earned bachelor's and master's degrees in piano performance from Seoul National University. He continued his piano studies in the United States receiving another master's degree from Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University, a graduate diploma from New England Conservatory of Music, and a doctoral degree from University of Cincinnati. His musical mentors and teachers in piano chronologically include James Tocco, Eugene Pridonoff, Gabriel Chodos, Seth Knopp, Hyung Bae Kim, and Young-Mee Yun. Kang served as a graduate assistant at University of Cincinnati, teaching piano for undergraduate and graduate students from diverse musical backgrounds. In his piano studios, he taught numerous students over 16 years. In 2020-2021, he served as an Adjunct Professor of Piano and Staff Accompanist at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, coaching undergraduate and graduate voice students and providing accompaniment for Southwestern Singers, recitals, applied lessons, juries, and classes. Kang's musical passion is further extended to both choral and orchestral conducting: the latter was the cognate area of his doctoral study at University of Cincinnati. In 2015-2020, he served as a conductor for the choir and orchestra at Power Mission Baptist Church of Cincinnati. In 2020-2021, he studied conducting and theology of music in the master of music in church music program (conducting concentration) at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, while shaping theological understandings on music and its related topics as well as on his calling to live as a Christ-centered professional musician who glorifies God and serves people with music. Currently, Kang continues his conducting training, under the guidance of Allen Hightower, in the master of music in choral conducting program at University of North Texas, where he also serves as a TA accompanist for A Cappella Choir and Kalandra and sings with Vox Aquilae. His conducting teachers include Allen Hightower, Kristina MacMullen, Ian Yeung, Markand Thakar, Aik Khai Pung, Mark Gibson, Brett Scott, Annunziata Tomaro, Huan Jing, Charles Peltz, Erica Washburn, and William Drury.
